Social volunteering



This organisation aims to provide all its residents with the highest standard of care and nursing within a homely environment, and to promote quality of life, the maintenance of independence, and the preservation of dignity. Volunteers work with residents who come from all walks of life and socioeconomic backgrounds. Tasks include playing games, instruments, etc.



Work in a rural township community on the Garden Route where you will support children from the ages of 2 to 6. Volunteers provide basic day care and assistance with daily developmental programmes. This project requires lots of handson work, both in the classroom and outdoors.



This project caters for the children in a developing community near Hout Bay. As a volunteer, you spend mornings caring for young children while their parents are at work. Afternoons are spent in an aftercare programme that assists older children with their homework and creative activities once school has finished. Meals are also provided daily for all the children.





Volunteers joining this multipurpose facility can assist with education and social welfare programmes as well as outreach work focused on health and economic development by supporting mainly children and women. Tasks include helping in the kitchen, gardening, playing and more. This project is set in Nyanga, a township in Cape Town where the need is great.



Caring and loving volunteers help the staff at this unique organisation empower vulnerable children, who were potential or actual street children. The focus is to provide quality education and developmental programmes so that children reach their full potential and grow to become leaders in their communities.



This organization supports children and their immediate family in a dignified and compassionate manner and also provides a safe haven for abandoned and abused children. Volunteers join a variety of projects supported by the organization during their experience. For this project it is important to be flexible and take initiative.

Social volunteering



This centre exists for a small number of the many marginalized people in the Cape community and provides specialised care for 90 profoundly intellectually and physically disabled citizens. Participate in group and stimulation activities, help with meals and organise events. Make a real difference in the life of someone who needs it most!



This is an early intervention literacy programme. It supports children who are at risk in learning to read. To do this, the programme focuses on language enrichment, offering extra help and remedial assistance to children. This project runs during school hours but volunteers can choose to assist directly in the school as well.



This unique urban farming project will allow you to experience sustainable farming, education, and health promotion. The project encourages change in the way the public sees food production and purchasing and also teaches the community where our food really comes from, and how it can benefit the families that live here.

Combine volunteering with a language course



When you volunteer, it is essential that you are able to communicate clearly with your supervisor, colleagues and the people you are helping. A good command of English is therefore required for all projects.

If you need to brush up on your English skills, add a language course before you start volunteering. Doing this will also give you a chance to get accustomed to the country before you start at your project.

If your level of English already meets the minimum criteria, you may want to combine an English language course in the morning with volunteering in the afternoon. This option is available for most Cape Town based projects.

Our sister company, Good Hope Studies, operates an English language school from two campuses in Cape Town: one campus is situated in the leafy residential area of Newlands and the other is in the vibrant city centre on a pedestrian walkway.

Our school is well-known for the professional yet relaxed environment in which learning is both challenging and fun.
Students from up to 50 different countries benefit from our courses each year.

Our story

In 1994, Wolfgang Graser and Alexander Kratochwil moved from their home in Vienna to the beautiful city of Cape Town. They quickly fell in love with this vibrant city and its friendly, smiling people. They first opened an English language school for foreign tourists to learn English, but soon they discovered that behind the shiny places there are enormous problems and challenges that this country faces for historic reasons. They met with organisations that assist government in the struggle for a better life and a better environment.

When you see what these organisations do, it's not difficult to feel moved and share in their desire to help. They can't solve all problems overnight, but they do make an

impact and do change people's lives on a daily basis. What they need, though, are volunteers who share their passion to help and who want to make a difference.

In 2009, we started to supply some of these organisations with international volunteers. What we specifically loved was not only seeing these organisations thrive with the volunteers but also noticing how the volunteers themselves benefit hugely from the experience.

Over the years, we developed Good Hope Volunteers into a larger and more professional organisation. With our passion for communities, animals, and the environment, we have developed Good Hope

Since the onset of the world-wide COVID-19 pandemic in late 2019, a new challenge to sustainable tourism has been issued, and even more so to our projects. Some of them have had to close due to underfunding or lack of international volunteers.

Today we support around 30 projects in southern Africa. Most of them are able to welcome volunteers again; some are only available to volunteers who are fully vaccinated. Conservation volunteering



This sanctuary creates a safe and secure home for captive-bred big cats and raises awareness about the ethical and holistic treatment of animals. This 40-hectare paradise provides a beautiful home for the animals, and volunteers are involved in their day-to-day care and protection as well as the education of the public.



Most animals brought here are either orphaned baby animals or seriously injured adults who will be cared for at the sanctuary for a lifetime. Where possible, they are released back into their natural habitat. Situated on the Garden Route, the project is well located for exploring this unique terrain or doing a variety of sports in your free time.



A project that believes in a world where humans and nature can live together in harmony. Volunteers will have the opportunity to work with some of the most amazing wildlife species in Africa such as lions, rhinos, elephants, giraffes, cheetah, meerkats and many other indigenous species. Volunteers live and work on a working game reserve.



This centre is a pro-life, nonprofit organisation whose core aim is to rescue, rehabilitate, re-unite and re-home lost, abandoned, abused and neglected dogs and cats. Volunteers make a marked difference to the lives of the animals here and need to have patience and a deep love for the work they will do.



This heartfelt project's mission is to relieve the suffering of overworked and abused cart-horse donkeys by providing them with a forever home. The sanctuary is dedicated to the wellbeing of rural animals rescued from farms and a life of hardship. Animals at the sanctuary include donkeys, horses, cattle, ostriches and even a domesticated zebra, rescued from suffering.



This project aims to return this land along the beautiful Garden Route to its natural state and ensure a self-sustaining, functional ecosystem by rehabilitating agricultural land, expanding the reserve, and creating community awareness. Volunteers take part in research on various wild-life species and essential hands-on conservation work.



Provide good care and assist in the all-round functioning of the sables and outride & polo horse herd based along a 260-ha estate along the beautiful Garden Route. Some are well experienced trail outride mounts, others are still in-training, needing additional attentive care, handling and lunging. Some horses were rescued and rebuilding the human-horse trust element is crucial.



This foundation is dedicated to the conservation of the marine environment in South Africa through research, willingness to help, and dedication. You can make a real change for the future of South Africa's beautiful coastline and at the same time enjoy seeing whales, dolphins, seals and seabirds in their natural habitat.



An ocean-based project which aims to unite scientific research and public participation in the protection of South Africa's great white shark. Volunteers are primarily here to work closely with sharks and tourists. In doing so, they increase awareness of these wonderful creatures. You get involved in ocean conservation, shark wound healing, tagging and tracking.

Conservation volunteering



This project provides a safe haven for orphaned and injured African wildlife. Efforts are directed to long-term rehabilitation. Volunteers play an important role in caring for and feeding animals as well as helping with daily tasks at the sanctuary. This may be combined with supporting San children at a local school.



This programme provides a great opportunity to get involved in the conservation and sustainability of African wildlife and ecosystems. Not only are volunteers directly involved in protecting and studying African wildlife and ecosystems but they also undergo educational sessions where the focus is on teaching the bigger picture.



Combined social & conservation volunteering



Volunteer at a reserve that aims to promote the conservation of the indigenous fauna and flora of the Zandvlei wetland in Muizenberg. The programme is very broad and every day will be filled with a new adventure. Interact with people from across Africa and make a difference in the conservation of the reserve.



This is a unique project that focuses on building relationships between communities, families, and the animals and owners of game reserves in rural Botswana. It also offers support programmes and educational outreach activities in the hopes of bridging the delicate gap between all members of this unique environment.



This project offers a rare opportunity to combine community development and environmental protection. Volunteers will work directly with children from a local care facility as well as support environmental conservation efforts on a working game reserve.







Those who can't dive will have a dive course first. Volunteers dive every day during the week in the morning, collecting photographic data on turtles, mantas, whales and ragged-tooth sharks. Later in the day, the collected data is entered into database. For marine research efforts, marine lectures provide a deeper insight on ocean conservation.



South African wines are world-famous. The region has expanded to 16 vineyards with 10 boutique estates producing their own wines from a range of white and red cultivars.
